Spring grants push FML District over \$12 million mark

GLENWOOD SPRINGS, CO – With its announcement today of awards for its Spring 2015 Grant Cycle, the Garfield County Federal Mineral Lease (FML) District passed the \$12 million mark in grants awarded to date. Since its first grant cycle (Spring 2012), total grants awarded are \$12,034,343.00 to cities, towns, school districts, and many other political subdivisions within Garfield County.
